**Transitional Regulations
for the Bachelor's degree programme
European Business Management
(full-time and part-time study)
Bachelor of Arts**

Based on Sections 20 (2), 23 (2) and 81 (2) No. 1 of the Brandenburg Higher Education Act (BbgHG) of 9 April 2024 (GVBl.I/24, [No. 12]), last amended by Article 2 of the Act of 21 June 2024 (GVBl.I/24, No. 30) in conjunction with Section 14 (3) of the Basic Regulations of the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau in the version published on 21 August 2019 (Official Notices of the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau No. 45/2019), last amended on 22 August 2022 (Official Notices of the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau 29/2022) and the provisions of the General Regulations of the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau of 4 July 2019 (Official Notices of the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau No. 42/2019), last amended on 29 May 2024 (Official Notices of the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau No. 12/2024) the Faculty Board of the Faculty of Business, Computing, Law at the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau, by resolution of 10 November 2025, the following transitional regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management, approved by the President of the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau by letter dated 16 January 2026:

SectionSection 1 Contents and scope

- (1) The transitional regulations govern the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management in the event of a possible change by students who were enrolled up to and including the summer semester of 2025 under the Study and Examination Regulations of 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024) and, in accordance with the internship regulations of January 19, 2026 (Official Notices No. 05/2016) for the recognition of examination achievements already completed in the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management and the examination achievements still to be completed for the completion of the programme in accordance with the Study and Examination Regulations of 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024) and in accordance with the internship regulations dated January 19, 2026 (Official Notices No. 05/2016) .
- (2) In addition, in the event of a continuation of the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management for students who were enrolled up to and including Summer Semester 2025, the transitional regulations govern the examination achievements still to be completed in the amended modules for the completion of the programme following the change in the curriculum from the 2025/2026 enrolment year onwards.

Section 2 Discontinuation of the Study and Examination Regulations and the internship regulations for the Bachelor's programme European Business Management (Bachelor of Arts)

The following Study and Examination Regulations as well as the internship regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management at the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau shall cease to have effect at the end of Winter Semester 2032/2033:

Section 3

Legal consequences of the discontinuation of the Study and Examination Regulations and the Internship Regulations for the Bachelor's degree programme European Business Management (Bachelor of Arts)

- (1) From Winter Semester 2025/2026 onwards, no students will be admitted or enrolled in the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management for the first or higher semesters in accordance with the Study and Examination Regulations specified in Section 2.
- (2) All students enrolled in the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management before Winter Semester 2025/2026 will have the opportunity to complete their examinations up to and including Winter Semester 2032/2033. The same applies to the completion of final theses. Registration for the thesis should be made in good time so that any resubmission can be completed within this period. There is no further entitlement to examinations. Students who have not completed their studies within this period cannot be awarded a degree in this programme in addition to the regulations governing examinations (loss of examination entitlement). They must be exmatriculated unless they transfer to another programme at the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau or an exception applies in accordance with Section 4.

The regulations on the recognition of academic and examination achievements in accordance with the General Regulations and the Study and Examination Regulations of the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau apply to transfers to another degree programme at the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau.

- (3) For students of the previous Bachelor's programme in European Business Management, the provisions on the deadlines for examinations and repeat examinations apply in accordance with the regulations of the General Regulations of the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau in conjunction with the Study and Examination Regulations for the degree programme.

Until these deadlines expire, students in the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management are allowed to take examinations in accordance with the relevant Study and Examination Regulations; with regard to the enrolment year of the last matriculation (Winter Semester 2024/2025), they are entitled to an appropriate range of courses, university services and to take part in examinations.

- (4) If students have failed to fulfil study and examination requirements in accordance with Section 3 and are not responsible for this failure, or if the provision in Section 3 results in undue hardship as a consequence of these statutes, the Examinations Board may decide on exceptions. Exceptions are decided on a one-off and final basis. In such cases, the Examinations Board shall extend the examination period in accordance with Section 3 appropriately, depending on the case of hardship at hand, without concluding a study progress agreement. In the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management, the maximum possible length of an extension for reasons of hardship is until the end of the respective standard period of study for the programme concerned plus a further ten semesters, calculated from Summer Semester 2028. The extension of the examination period and exemption from study programme advice shall not be granted if the disadvantage has already been compensated for within the framework of the programme. After the expiry of the extension of the examination period granted on grounds of hardship, Section 2 shall apply.

- (5) Unreasonable hardship as understood in Section 4 exists if a student was prevented from meeting the deadlines specified in Section 3 due to exceptional circumstances beyond their control. These include, in particular:

- a.) Periods during which the student was forced to interrupt their studies due to illness,
- b.) periods during which a student's studies were extended due to a prolonged or permanent disability or chronic illness,
- c.) periods of maternity leave and periods during which students were restricted in their ability to study due to the birth of a child and the necessary care and provision for the child after birth, up to a maximum of two semesters,
- d.) periods spent caring for a close relative in need of care in accordance with the Care Leave Act.

The student must substantiate the existence of undue hardship by presenting the facts and evidence in writing, in the case of illness or disability by submitting a medical certificate from a specialist.

- (6) If a student in the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management still has a right to take examinations and the opportunity to take the examinations required to

complete their studies, in line with the above provisions, even though the corresponding courses and examinations are no longer available, the student must immediately consult with the responsible degree programme director to agree on an individual examination plan for completing the programme (study plan). If this degree programme director is not a university lecturer, he or she must consult a university lecturer for this advice. The study plan shall be recorded in writing and signed by the student, the degree programme director and, if applicable, the university lecturer consulted, and shall be added to the student's file. A copy shall be given to the student, the Department of Admission and Examinations and the Examinations Board responsible.

If the student fails to comply with this obligation, the Examinations Board responsible may, after issuing a notification and a deadline of a reasonable period of time, refuse the right to take the examination, notwithstanding Section 2.

Section 4

Remaining under previous Study and Examination Regulations for European Business Management and transferring to the new Study and Examination Regulations for European Business Management

- (1) Students who commenced their studies in the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management at the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau before Winter Semester 2025/2026 may, up to and including Winter Semester 2032/2033, be examined in accordance with the relevant Study and Examinations Regulations specified in Section 2 or continue their studies in accordance with the Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management dated 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024) (change).
- (2) In the event of a change in the Study and Examinations Regulations pursuant to Section 1, the student must submit an application to the Department of Admission and Examinations to continue in the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management dated 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024).
- (3) Students subject to the previous versions of the Study and Examinations Regulations for the European Business Management programme (Section 2) only have until 15 July 2032 to switch to the Study and Examinations Regulations for the European Business Management programme dated 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024).
- (4) The Department of Admission and Examinations will issue a decision on the application for transfer:
 - (a) If the student's application has been approved without restrictions, the transfer to the Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management dated 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024) is complete.
 - (b) If the student's application has been approved only in part or with changes, the student is free to accept the decision within a period of 14 days and to study in accordance with the Study and Examinations Regulations for the

- Bachelor's programme in European Business Management dated 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024).
- (c) If the decision is not accepted by the student, the student must continue to study in accordance with the Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management applicable to him/her.
 - (d) It is not possible to transfer from studying under the Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management dated 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024) back to studying under the previous Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management.
- (5) If the programme has been completed in accordance with the previous Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management, it is no longer possible to apply to transfer to the Study and Examination Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management dated 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024). This also applies in the case of unsuccessful completion of the programme.###
 - (6) If a student submits an application to switch from the previous Study and Examination Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management dated 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024), the failed examination attempts must be determined and applied for all creditable examinations, provided that the modules are equivalent. The equivalent modules are listed in Appendix A of these regulations in an equivalence table.
 - (7) Credits that cannot be credited under the Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management dated 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024) shall be certified by the faculty as additional credits in accordance with Section 28 (4) of the General Regulations of the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau.
 - (8) In the event of a change, modules or examination achievements in the new Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management of 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024) can be completed at the earliest in the semester in which they are regularly scheduled for these Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management according to the timetable upon enrolment in Winter Semester 2025/2026. Before transferring, students can consult with the degree programme director for advice on this matter and, in particular, on the standard period of study.

Section 5

Courses offered under the discontinued Study and Examination Regulations

- (1) Teaching in accordance with the expiring Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management must be ensured at least for the period specified in Section 3 (3). The faculty responsible for the programme shall ensure the implementation of courses and examinations in cooperation with the module supervisors involved in the programme.

- (2) The courses offered in the individual semesters will be discontinued on a rolling basis each semester.
- (3) If equivalent courses, which enable students under the discontinued Study and Examinations Regulations to complete the study and examination requirements necessary for graduation, are offered in other degree programmes at the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau the courses may be discontinued at an earlier date. The equivalence of the courses is determined by the module supervisors. Courses may only be discontinued for future semesters and the decision to do so shall be taken by the Faculty Board in agreement with the relevant Examinations Board, in particular taking into account Section 3 (3) and Section 4 (1). Students shall be informed of the options referred to in Sentence 1 before courses are discontinued and shall be advised as necessary.
- (4) According to the new Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management dated 10 December 2024 (Official Notices 34/2024) of the Technical University of Applied Sciences Wildau, equivalent courses are offered which enable students of the previous Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management to complete the study and examination requirements necessary for graduation. These equivalent courses can be found in Appendix B of these regulations.
The Examinations Board shall decide on any further equivalence of courses on a case-by-case basis upon receipt of a well-founded request.

Section 6

Information provisions

Students studying under the Study and Examinations Regulations for the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management according to the Study and Examinations Regulations of 20 August 2021 (Official Notice 20/2021), 14 December 2021 (Official Notice 31/2021) and 18 February 2022 (Official Notice 07/2022), 20 March 2023 (Official Notice 03/2023) will be informed of the transitional regulations and the consequences thereof in Winter Semester 2024/2025, at least in text form, by the degree programme director. In particular, an individual study plan will be agreed with part-time students with the aim of ensuring that they complete their studies in a timely manner.

Section 7

Entry into force

These statutes shall enter into force on the day after their publication in the Official Notices and shall apply to all cohorts enrolled in the Bachelor's programme in European Business Management in accordance with the Study and Examinations Regulations of 20 August 2021 (Official Notice 20/2021), 14 December 2021 (Official Notice 31/2021) and 18 February 2022 (Official Notice 07/2022), and 20 March 2023 (Official Notice 03/2023).
